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22	On October 22, 2020, the Court heard oral argument on Plaintiffs' Motion to Approve the	
23	Form and Manner of Notice to the Class. Having considered the parties' submissions, oral	
24	argument, the relevant law, and the record in this case, the Court GRANTS Plaintiffs' Motion to	
25	Approve the Form and Manner of Notice to the Class with the modification that published notice	
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27	be limited to publication in newspapers, a case website, and digital publication to extend notice to	
28	entity Class Members, as set forth in paragraphs 28, 36 and 38 of the Keough Declaration (ECF	
	No. 856-2). The Court further orders as follows:	

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[PROPOSED] ORDER APPROVING FORM AND MANNER OF NOTICE

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- 1. The Court finds that Plaintiffs' proposed notice program fully complies with Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 23 and due process and constitutes the best notice practicable under the circumstances.
- 2. The Court finds that taken together, mailing by U.S. Mail, and emailing the Summary Notice to those addresses of class members that are available to Class Counsel, and publication notice: (i) are the best notice practicable; (ii) are reasonably calculated to, under the circumstances, to apprise members of the Class of the action and of their right to exclude themselves; (iii) are reasonable and constitute due, adequate, and sufficient notice to all persons entitled to receive notice; and (iv) meet all applicable requirements of due process and any other applicable requirements under federal or state law.
- 3. The Court approves the form of the: a) Long Form Notice of Pendency attached to the Keough Declaration at Exhibit B; b) Postcard Notice attached to the Keough Declaration as Exhibit C; c) Email Notice attached to the Keough Declaration as Exhibit D; d) Summary Notice for publication attached to the Keough Declaration as Exhibit E; and e) examples of the digital ads attached to the Keough Declaration as Exhibit F.¹
- 4. Class Counsel has retained JND Legal Administration ("JND"), an experienced class notice administration firm, to administer notice to the Class. The Court appoints JND as the Class Notice Administrator. JND shall provide notice of pendency of the class action consistent with the procedures outlined in the Keough Declaration.
- 5. Dissemination of notice shall commence on December 15, 2020 and shall conclude no later than January 22, 2021 ("Notice Period").
- 6. Class Members may elect to not be part of the Class. To request to be excluded from the Class, Class Members must timely submit a written request for exclusion. The request for

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exclusion must be sent by postal mail to JND. To be excluded from the Class, the request for exclusion must be postmarked by the Exclusion Deadline, which shall be March 8, 2021, 45 days after the conclusion of the Notice Period. Any person or entity who falls within the definition of the Class and who validly and timely requests exclusion from the Class shall not be a Class Member and will not be entitled to any money or benefits that may result from a trial or settlement of the lawsuit but will be bound by any injunctive relief that the Court may order in the lawsuit.
